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
The three little pigs are brothers. They are going into the forest. They want to build three houses.

He sings, 'Hum de hum, dum de dum, hee de dum, dee de hum,' when he works.




The third little pig, Patrick, is very clever. He gets some bricks and he starts to build a house of bricks.

'Can I come in, little pigs? I'm not very bia!' he savs.


Percy, Peter and Patrick say, 'Go away! You can't come in. You're the big, bad wolf, you horrible thing.'


